8:06 p.m., 9/2/09: Firefighters continued to make progress on several fronts, but the southeastern flank continued to bear down on mountain hamlets and other forest landmarks. The fire pushed southeast into the mountains high above Sierra Madre and Monrovia as firefighters tried to save portions of Santa Anita Canyon, Chantry Flats, Devil's Canyon, Sturtevant's Camp and other areas. Officials were trying to push the fire north into the wildlands. Evacuation orders were canceled in many areas, including all of Glendale and Sunland-Tujunga, and most of Altadena. La Crescenta and La Cañada Flintridge's evacuations were lifted yesterday. Evacuation orders remained in place in Soledad Canyon, south of Action; on the Angeles Forest Highway, south of Aliso Canyon; Big Tujunga Canyon; and Little Tujunga Canyon.
